After a few months off after the most excellent 125<sup>th</sup> Celebration in May, 2001 your hard-working Association is back in action! Things are changing at Vic High. We have welcomed a new principal, Keith Forshaw, who replaced Denis Harrigan in early 2002. Denis was a great help, as were the rest of the School staff, in putting on the 125<sup>th</sup>. By all accounts it was a fine party, and we hope that you enjoyed it. AND we were able to reach our fundraising goals, thanks to all Alumni and friends who contributed. A big THANK YOU to everybody from the Alumni Board!

We have some special treats for you. Please see the advert herein for a set of memento VHS tapes of the 125<sup>th</sup> Celebration, and a special bonus CD of the May 5<sup>th</sup> Alumni Orchestra concert in the School Auditorium. Speaking of which, we need to finish what we started with the 125<sup>th</sup> fundraiser: So far,

through our efforts, \$75,000 has been raised and spent to install carpeting, acoustical panels and accessories into the heritage School Auditorium. It is a nice improvement. But we still need a sound and light system and booth in the middle of the balcony. Then it would be great. I am sure that you can all remember, especially those involved in drama and music, how sound would just disappear and the lights would blind you. A modern school needs a good auditorium, and the School District is too broke to do what needs to be done. Especially as Vic High, as of this September, now has an increased population of 1200 students due to the addition of grades 9 and 10 under the District's current middle school re-organization program. So we need \$45,000 to finish off the project. We are happy to say that the 125<sup>th</sup> fundraising effort, in addition to replacing the old Centennial Bus with 2 new, 15 seater vans that now see constant use, plus topping up the

## CHANGES AT VHS

With the reconfiguration of our School District, we are pleased to be able to again welcome Grade 9 students to our Victoria High School Family. This is the first such enrollment since the 1953-54 school year when, according to my records, we enrolled four divisions of Grade 9's. After this there was a change in the junior high school make-up to include Grades 8,9 and 10, leaving only Grades 11 and 12 for the senior high schools, a deplorable situation in our opinion at the time. We did, however, offer courses at the Grade 10 level to accommodate students who were short some Grade 10 subjects. Because of this, we were able to encourage a number of full-time Grade 10 students to enroll for the extra year of the senior high experience. One such student graduating in 1979 commented in our School Annual, the Camosun: "Come to Vic High in Grade 10 and enjoy 3 great years."

## Membership Report

HOW TIME FLIES! Just 10 years ago the concept of an Alumni Association was presented to the existing Centennial Committee and received their blessing to attempt to put together a working committee. A lot of support immediately surfaced from Staff, Support Staff and grads, as an action committee was formed. The initial goal was to raise \$10,000 through a membership drive, and it was estimated that 10% interest on this sum would be sufficient to pay the then-annual Alumni scholarships and bursaries, which were then sapping the depleted Centennial Committee capital fund. Promotion of class reunions by the new Alumni Association was initially quite successful in both raising awareness of the Association and selling memberships. Some "arm-twisting" occurred, but it was clear then that we were backing a winner. Now, 10 years later, the Vic High Alumni Association, one of the few such associations in public schools in the country, is setting the standard and being extensively copied. Bravo to the Association and those that have worked so hard to bring this to reality. We have now issued 4,475 membership cards and have a mailing list of nearly 14,000 names. This membership includes 275 new 2002 grads. Many successful activities have been organized and taken place, culminating in the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in May 2001. More than \$250,000 has been raised for the School, an endowment fund has been established, and a widely renowned Alumni Archives has been developed. NOT BAD for an attempt to raise \$10,000 a decade ago - and a good thing, as interest rates aren't 10% anymore.

## Principal's Report

It has been a hectic but very successful start to our school year! The staff has worked incredibly hard to make a major transition from a school enrolling 850 grade 11's and 12's to a school enrolling 1179 students from grades 9 through 12. This is kind of like 'back to the future' for Vic High. Included in this number are 31 international students from 9 different countries. In addition, there have been significant additions to our staff as well as the acquisition of resource material, equipment, supplies, and furniture, all of which constituted a massive undertaking. Notable

building alterations have been carried out with great care, and the renovations fit in nicely with the rest of this wonderful Vic High building.

We also have a revitalized Parent Advisory Committee who are keen and enthusiastic. The Alumni Association's support of our scholarship program, as well as providing the school vans for transportation, makes a tremendous difference to our school and the students. The Archives are an outstanding resource for both the school and the community.
