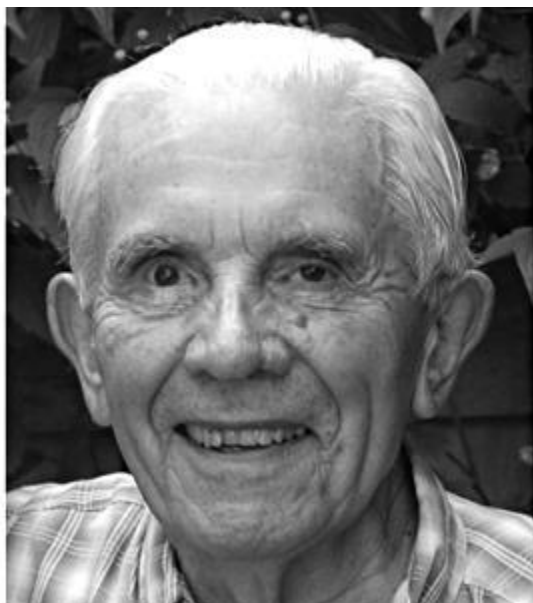


Kenneth A. Wills – VHS Class of 1940
