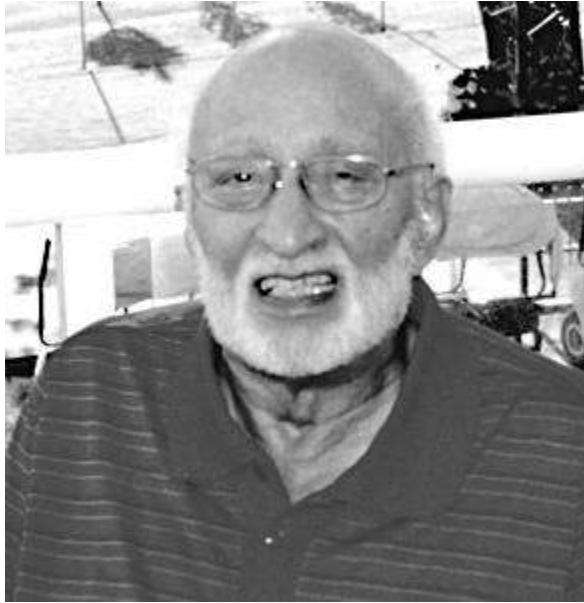


## Ranjit (Jake) Sangha – Vic High Class of 1952
