



HUNDLEBY, Maurice Alan "Maury" October 26, 1922 - March 19, 2016

With deepest sadness we announce the passing of Maury Hundleby. He passed at Broadmead Lodge, mercifully quickly in the arms of his son Norman, minutes after they shared a good laugh. Maury is lovingly remembered by his children Walter (Lynda), Norman, Marcia (Al Sabourin), grandchildren Karen and Mark (Jessica), great-grandchildren Liam and Lily, nieces and nephews. Predeceased by his beloved wife Maxie in 2014, he was the last member of a family of 8. As a youth he loved hiking, mountain climbing, camping, bowling, cycling, fishing, boating and practical joking. A 1940 Vic High grad, he was conscripted in '42 for WWII, joined the campaign overseas in '44, and participated in the Liberation of the Netherlands; toured and documented post-war Europe from the back of an Army truck. Returning to Victoria in '46, he met the love of his life, Mary "Maxie" Maximenko. Married March 26, 1949. After the war he started work at the Old Age Security and Family Allowance Branch. In the 50's he built two houses, designed and tended beautiful gardens, became a father of three, and built a 23' boat "WANOMA". With other Dogwood Trailer Club members, he took part in building "Pacific Shores Trailer Inn". In '66 Mom and Dad visited where he was stationed in the war. Later they enjoyed many cruises to Alaska and Hawaii and traveling to Russia, US and Barbados. He retired in '77 as Administrator of Finance and Personnel at OAS&FA. Then he joined the Monterey Center and created many unique works of art in wood, taught woodcarving, enjoyed singing & conducting. In June 2009 Maury & Maxie moved from 2505 Eastdowne to Broadmead, continuing to fill their lives with love, music, laughter, and humor. Through Sylvain, Maury shared his well-documented wartime photo album with other Canadian Nijmegen marchers. Maury had a positive upbeat attitude, a wonderful full life, loved by everyone, very easy to get along with, a very generous man. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him. We would like to thank the wonderful staff of Broadmead Lodge for their loving care. A special thanks to all entertainers, particularly Pat and Jessie.
