- 1. Term 3 has ended, term 4 started.

REPORTS

Secretary's Report: Linda Baker

New Secretary

If the new bylaws are approved, we will be electing four directors at the June 8 AGM, not five. The Board should discuss actions that have been taken and could be taken to ensure the position of Secretary is filled at the directors' meeting following the AGM.

Special General Meeting JoAnne Botten will assist at the meeting.

Attendance of approximately 20-22 people is expected, with half attending in person and half via Zoom. The Vic High library is booked for the meeting. Two laptops will be set up to manage the meeting – one as Zoom host where Zoom attendees' images will project onto the large screen, and one as a Zoom attendee with camera pointing towards the in-person attendees and meeting chair.

Operations Review

Over the past several years, the Alumni has

- evolved from somewhat of an office-based operation (Vic High Archives room) to a virtual operation,
- grown considerably website, regular newsletter, more scholarships/bursaries and endowed funds to manage, and significantly more engagement with the membership,
- anticipated increased workload if we are to take advantage of the upcoming school re-opening and 2025-26 anniversaries (Alumni's 50th, Vic High's 150th),
- identified goals to
 - o raise funds for Vic High,
 - ensure sustainable operational funding,
 - o ensure sustainable team of volunteers
 - o maximize valuable volunteer time
 - publish the next history of Vic High

Technology predictions strongly suggest that content currently created on a computer and stored on the cloud, will in future be created on the cloud. That already happens all over the world, where people log

onto a shared platform in order to create/share information, meet, conduct discussions, etc. We need to move now towards that eventuality or risk becoming less appealing operationally for new volunteers, and less able to achieve the goals outlined above.

Shannon Edgar and I are identifying tasks performed by Alumni volunteers and tasks where additional help is needed. We'll be seeking input for the initial draft. We plan to

- Identify annual Compliance requirements (recordkeeping, financial reporting, charitable status requirements, etc.),
- recommend minimum operating standards to ensure continuity of operation in an organization where volunteers come and go,
- Recommend virtual operating platform to guarantee compliance and support achievement of our goals,
- Identify all tasks current and proposed in a clear visual chart, and how those tasks are or should be reflected in Board accountability,
- ensure simple task descriptions are created to make it easier to ensure accurate continuity of operations when volunteers change

Archives & Museum Report: Annie Boldt

- · There have been ongoing requests for Alumni history requests by families seeking information for mostly genealogy issues which I have dealt with as best I can due to our limited resources. (350 boxes of our Archival materials stored in locked units in the Fairey Tech Concourse).
- · Linda Baker has been in phone contact with Randal Fairey re: his grandfather, Frances Fairey's personal history for an article for the Alumni News on the Fairey Tech's namesake.
- · Linda & I had a little meeting with 'Fergie' Andison, to talk about producing a little book dedicated to the ATTIC, not as a commercial money raiser but for the Archives reference shelf.
- · Linda has been in regular email contact with Priscilla Giroux whose title is, "Program Officer for the Commemoration Division of Veteran's Affairs, Government of Canada." She is putting together some Info Sheets on the VHS Memorial banner, the Memorial Maple trees, the framed Honor Roll, the stadium and the WW1 and WW2 'Memorial Tablets' as they are called. Some more work needs to be done on the provenance of the stained-glass windows depicting a wreath, VHS logo and 2 poppies which I will do.
- · I have also reached out to my fellow VHS class of 1967 alumnus, John Adams, to find a local Archive Paper Conservationist who may be able to help me restore the cover of the Ernest Fairey 1915 pocket diary.

- Big thank you to Linda for doing all sorts of running around for me since I am confined to home for the next few weeks!
- On-line ticket sales slowed a bit. Expect a push after the April Newsletter release.
- Budget prepared and provided to Fern.
- Focus now on recordings to be scheduled over the next 2 weeks; then video preparations will begin.
- Program is well under way waiting for ads and photos.
- Still waiting for replies from a couple of invited guests.
- Display boards to be done in late April.
- Day of the event:
 - o Reception at the door need one or two more people.
 - Event set up (possibly Friday) and clean up.
 - Hosts for invited guest/honourees.

Communications Report: Linda Baker, Mary Anne Skill, King Lee

Part of the team's function is to support two goals:

- Raising funds for initiatives and equipment needed in the 'new' Vic High
- Increasing the number of alumni for whom we have an email address

One strategy is to gradually increase public awareness of the Alumni as we move towards school reopening celebrations (spring 2024), and the 2025-2026 school year (Alumni's 50th anniversary, Vic High's 150th anniversary)

Scholarships & Bursaries: Don Kissinger

1. Helen Maxwell Bursary

Kirsty Maxwell, April 3, 2023 advises I will receive the Executor fee in the next few weeks so expect to be able to complete contributions soon after. Closer to the time I will check again on the total needed.

- 2. **Sean Wallace Email :**We currently offer the following athletic scholarships:
- Judy Bourne Memorial (VHS) \$500 Outstanding participation in athletics school and/or community. An all-round student with an emphasis on attitude, citizenship, and school participation.
- Victoria Police Athletic Association Citizenship (VHS) \$750 Distinguished athletic abilities and/or support for athletics. Demonstrated outstanding school and community citizenship.
- Frontrunners Award (VHS) \$500 Student who is active in athletics in and outside of school.

All of them are funded by yearly donations from the community and therefore are not guaranteed. In fact, we went two years without awarding the VicPD Scholarship because the athletic organization was in disarray. Frontrunner understandably paused their scholarship during covid and then reduced it from \$1000 to \$500.

We are hesitant to create a scholarship for "top" or "best" athlete as we want to have some wiggle room to avoid giving money to students who we aren't confident will attend post-secondary. If we created criteria that recognized "a deserving athlete" it would give us discretion to recognize our top athletes when appropriate, or recognize our top student-athletes (academics and athletics), or two a athlete who has demonstrated excellence and overcome adversity. Given some time, I could draft up some TorRs that would cover this.

As for academics, I think we have lots of bursaries for students who have need or have overcome adversity. What we don't have, other than the Peter Smith Memorial, is money for the students who are high achievers, but don't do volunteer or community work, or haven't overcome adversity. I think we probably have 3-5 really strong academic students each year who go unrecognized because they don't fit into any of the current categories. Again, I could right some TofRs for an award in the future.

3. Interest in a bursary supposedly started years ago:

I called a Hollie High who was looking for info about a bursary. Her mother, Carol Sturrock/nee Charters, possibly class of 1956, died Feb 3, 1996. She was told by her step father that a bursary had been set up under her name. I told her I had never heard of one with that name but would enquire at the next exec meeting.

Her other information was that her father, Richard Stanley Anderson, class of 1954, died November 3, 2021 and this information has not been added to his VHS alumni record. I will get back to her after the meeting.

4. Victoria Foundation Donor-Advised Grant

We've been notified by the Foundation of a \$240 grant from an existing fund – Tombolo Fund – for the Gidney Bursary Fund. The required thank you letter has been sent. Funds have been received.


